English Language Competence - CIArb training and assessment is carried out in English. It is therefore essential that candidates are proficient in both written and spoken English. Where English is not a candidate's first language it is recommended that they have achieved a score of 94-101 in the (TOEFL) or similar system. CIArb issues this advice as a guideline and not as a requirement. Candidates who do not have this standard of English may be disadvantaged.

Course Assessment

The assessment will be a Three (3) Hour closed book examination on 13 December 2018. The examination is split into two parts :

Part I (compulsory)- Case study exercise worth 40%

Part 2 - Made up of 5 questions. Candidates must answer 3 out of the 5 questions making u

Candidates must achieve a minimum overall mark of 55% to pass the assessments. Results will be available within Six (6) to Eight (8) Weeks.
